¹ A transferee to UPSE who has already completed Econ 11 in another UP unit may take the Econ 11 validation exam. If the student passes the validation exam, the units and grade in Econ 11 earned from another UP unit will be credited as Econ 11 in the BS Business Economics curriculum. Otherwise, the student has to re-take Econ 11 in UPSE.

² A shiftee or transferee to UPSE who has already completed Econ 100.1 AND Econ 100.2 in UPSE or another UP unit may take the Econ 11 validation exam. If the student passes the validation exam, the units and grades earned in Econ 100.1 and Econ 100.2 will be credited in lieu of Econ 11 in the BS Business Economics curriculum. Otherwise, the student has to re-take Econ 11 in UPSE.

³ Students are required to choose 3 Business Electives (BE) from the following: BA 170, BA 151, BA 142, BA 105, BA 190, BA 102, Econ 167, HRIM 164, IE 3, IE 197(a), IE 197(b), IE 197(c), IE 150, IE 141, IE 142, Math 150.1, Math 180.1, Math 180.2, Stat 102.

⁴ At least three (3) of the free electives must be higher electives, i.e., with course number 100 and above, which may be taken outside of the Department. Foreign language courses, regardless of course number, are considered higher electives. They may also be Economics (Econ) electives.

⁵ BA 101 or IE 31 or HRIM 112. If two or more of these courses are taken, the course/s not used as Management Elective 1 may be credited as free elective/s.

⁶ BA 141 or Econ 122 Financial Economics I. If both courses are taken, Econ 122 may be credited as an Econ elective or free elective.

⁷ BA 115 or Econ 162 Managerial Economics. If both courses are taken, Econ 162 may be credited as an Econ elective or free elective.

⁸ Econ 109/111/118. If two or more of these courses are taken, the course/s not used as Econ History Elective may be credited as Econ elective/s or free elective/s.

⁹ BA 148 or Econ 123 Financial Economics II. If both courses are taken, Econ 123 may be credited as an Econ elective or free elective.

¹⁰ Economics (Econ) electives: Econ 109 / 111 / 118 / 122 / 123 / 138 / 153 / 161 / 162 / 167 / 168 / 171 / 172 / 178 / 181 / 186 / 191 / 196 / 198, excluding Econ 100.1 / Econ 100.2 and Econ 190.1 / 190.2. Econ 118, Econ 138, Econ 168, and Econ 178 may be taken two times provided the topics are different. Econ 198 may be taken two or more times provided the topics are different.

Students should complete pertinent prerequisite subjects prior to enrolling in the different electives.

All students required to take Math 21 must have passed any of the following: (1) High School Basic Calculus from the STEM or any strand of K-12; (2) the Validation Examination for Math 20 (Precalculus: Functions and their Graphs) administered by the UPD Institute of Mathematics; or (3) Math 20 as a non-credit course.

Those who have passed the equivalent of Math 21 in other universities or UP units are deemed to have complied with the Math 20 requirement.

Those students who have High School Basic Calculus from the STEM or any strand of K-12 are exempted from taking Math 20.

As a requirement for graduation, all students must take six (6) units in one of the National Service Training Program (NSTP) components: Civic Welfare Training Service (CWTS), Literacy Training Service (LTS), and Reserved Officers' Training Corps Military Science (ROTC Mil Sci). These are offered by UPD.
